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Early Childhood Learning Framework An Exciting Development

The Government of Newfoundland and Labrador is currently in the final stages of developing the Early Childhood Learning Framework to support parents and other adults who care for children birth to eight years of age. The overall purpose of the framework is to provide quality, evidence-based information to help guide parents/caregivers and the broader community to enhance early learning opportunities for children.

The Department for Education is taking the lead in the development of the framework. This spring several NLFRP members were asked to provide feedback and input into the applicability of the framework.

The content of the framework is divided into five sections:

- Part I An Introduction to Early Childhood Learning in Newfoundland and Labrador
- Part 2 Principles of Early Childhood Learning
 - o Who We Are
 - Our Connections

- How We Learn
- Part 3 Goals of Early Childhood Learning
 - Well-Being and Belonging
 - Communication
 - Play and Exploration
 - Social Contribution
- Part 4 Putting Into Practice
 - Early Childhood Learning
