NLFRP Update

During the NLFRP Annual General Meeting which was held on June 9th in Deer Lake, the Board presented its Annual Report. Some of the highlights of the past year that were outlined in the report included the planning, coordination and facilitation of the NLFRP Provincial Conference "Building the Bond—Staying Strong" which took place on May 6-8, 2014 in Gander, NL. The conference was well attended with approximately 160 participants from FRCs across the province.

Planning is now ongoing for a professional development event in the fall 2015/winter 2016 as well as for the next networking conference in the spring of 2016.

During the fall 2014, the provincial government released the Poverty Reduction Strategy Report and held consultations across the island. Individuals and groups were also invited to submit briefs. NLFRP hosted a consultation

with its members via conference call and submitted a brief on behalf of the Association. The PRS Consultation Brief was submitted to all members via email.

It has been another busy year for the NLFRP. Work is being done to revise the work plan for 2015-2017.


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NLFRP Membership Renewal—Mark Your Calendars!

Positive Discipline in Everyday Parenting

The challenge of parenting is enormous - to take the hand of a brand-new human being and guide her toward adulthood, teaching her all she needs to know to have a happy. successful life. There are times in all parents' lives when the challenge seems overwhelming. Sometimes we lose control of our emotions, or feel helpless, or resort to shouting and hitting. But there is another way. "Discipline" actually means "teaching." Teaching is based on setting goals and finding solutions to challenges. "Positive discipline" is nonviolent and respects the child as a learner. It is an approach to teaching that helps children succeed, gives them information, and supports their growth.


This innovative and empowering approach to child discipline was developed by Joan Durrant Ph.D. (University of Manitoba) for Save the Children Sweden in 2007. Positive discipline is based on children's rights to healthy development, protection from violence and participation in their learning. Parents are shown how they can teach their children while respecting their human rights. It is relevant to parents of all children from infancy to adolescence. Positive Discipline is:

- Non-violent
- Respectful
- Solution-focused
 Based on child development principles

Positive Discipline in Everyday Parenting is a set of principles

that can be applied in a wide range of situations. It can guide all interactions with children, not just the challenging ones.

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Nobody's Perfect Training



NLFRP has been involved in the revitalization of the Nobody's Perfect Parenting Program in partnership with CYFS, Health and Community Services, Public Health Agency of Canada and FRP Canada. In March 2014, two members of the NLFRP executive traveled to Ottawa to participate in a three day NP Train the Trainer Session and a two-day National Meeting. Other provincial

stakeholders from CYFS and Health and Community Services also attended the national meeting. Funding was also secured from FRP Canada to host a Provincial Consultation held in St. John's on April 29, 2014. The Consultation provided an opportunity for provincial stakeholders to identify priorities and future direction for the delivery of the Nobody's Perfect Program throughout the province. NLFRP has obtained a funding grant of \$9,600 from FRP Canada to support regional and provincial NP activities. PHAC has updated the program resources. It is



hoped that they will be available in the fall 2015 and NP Facilitator's Training will take place in the Spring of 2016. In addition, during the fall, the Provincial NP Steering Committee will be meeting to discuss priorities and begin the development of an action plan for the next 2-3 years.
