This Year's Highlights

This year is the 20th Anniversary for Family Resource Centres that started through the National Child Benefit Reinvestment Fund back in 1999 and it is the 25th Anniversary for CAPC/CPNP family resource centres! The NLFRP would like to take this time to celebrate the 28 Family Resource Programs that make up our membership and to continue to support them as they serve thousands of families and children across the province.

The NLFRP provides support to these Family Resource Centres through its \$500 grant which is available to each of the five regions on an annual basis. This year the St. John's Region used the grant to hold a one-day Regional Networking and Professional Development Workshop. Topics included: Networking/Sharing; CMHA—Anxiety in Young Children and Community Supports; Food NL—Supports and Programs; Eastern Health—Breastfeeding.

The NLFRP also supports Family Resource Programs through its biennial conference . The last conference, "Cheer for Families—Together We Grow" was held at the Quality Inn in Gander from June 5-7, 2018 included a half-day visioning session facilitated by Bobbie Boland. The NLFRP is using the summary from the visioning session to guide the work plan for the next five years.

In addition to the grant and Networking conference, the NLFRP continues to provide support to FRCs in the delivery of the Nobody's Perfect Parent Program. During the past year, the NLFRP has continued to partner with the Public Health Agency of Canada; Children, Seniors and Social Development; the Department of Education and the Early Childhood Development and Regional Health Authorities in the revitalization of the Nobody's Perfect Parenting Program and the delivery of Nobody's Perfect throughout the province. Facilitator training took place in Natuashish, Labrador and several NP programs for parents have been facilitated throughout the province. Two members of the NLFRP Board are also members of the Nobody's Perfect Provincial Steering Committee. NLFRP, in partnership with the NL Steering Committee and the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development, is providing grants of \$100 per program to assist with NP expenses such as refreshment and snacks. Parent books are also available upon request. The next Nobody's Prefect facilitator training is scheduled to take place October 1-4, 2019.

We are also pleased to announce that the NLFRP website is presently under development and will be launched in September 2019.

So it's been a busy 20th year for NLFRP, which was formed in 1999. We look forward to the next 20 and beyond!
